

## A Word from our Clergy.

A wonderful, Good News story; and many of us feel a special affinity for this guy – even though we can't spell his name! I think he is even more important than we realise. Here's why.

Luke, as do other New Testament writers, writes a lot about publicans, tax collectors and societal outcasts. To start, we need to remember that Zacc. was filthy rich, the chief tax collector, and a societal reject of huge proportions.

In Luke 5, the Pharisees ask Jesus why he eats with tax collectors and outcasts. This Pharisaic problem began (John 3) when outcasts came to John to be baptised. But Jesus reply rebukes the Pharisees, 'I have not come to call respectable people to repent, but outcasts.' The people we are talking about here are those that our society rejects, 'they are too far gone to be saved, or, the roof would fall in if so and so went to church'. Then, there are the rich. In Luke 12 Jesus says, 'a person's true life is not made up of the things he owns, no matter how rich he may be.' Remember the foolish farmer parable where he keeps building bigger barns, and the rich young ruler who left Jesus when challenged to give away his riches? There is Jesus saying: 'it is harder for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for the rich to be saved.' The disciples then ask, 'Who, then, can be saved?' Good question.

Another group are those who didn't want Jesus changing their life, yet alone their lifestyle. Like Herod or the Pharisees, Sadducees and teachers of the Law, these people had created a very predictable and comfortable lifestyle and they sought Jesus out to criticize and condemn him.

There are, at least, two other significant themes in Luke – Jesus says to Zacc., 'I MUST stay in your house TODAY'. Jesus uses 'today' to show a sense of urgency.' And later Jesus says, 'salvation has come to this house TODAY.'

While 'Must' indicates that God has a plan, - this is the day when Zacc. must be saved, and tomorrow is too late. Commit to Jesus now! Whatever your social standing or description.

Can, then, a man like Zacc bs saved? He's filthy rich, a chief taxman, totally rejected by all levels of society, but against the odds he sought to see and ended up sharing with Jesus. And this contact changed him to be very generous for he gave and restored anything stolen. A new man made by Jesus. This proves that anyone can be saved if they seek Jesus and are prepared to be challenged to change.

Are you seeking him...with all your heart?

#### Progress on Survey – Bulletin 2

#### Pastoral care.

Some suggestions for pastoral care were given as follows.

#### Different services to attract different age groups.

NB We have had 2 young people's services.

Many baptism services with and without communion.

An Aboriginal and Islander service

An MU tree planting service – with formal liturgy.

Another service with formal liturgy.

Services each week that try to incorporate different music styles and different forms of liturgy.

Unfortunately we are limited by the skills we have and the numbers of people who graciously give up their time each week.

We are also limited by the 8:30am or 6:30am time slots which are not user friendly times for families. Are we as a parish willing to seriously put energy into trying a new time slot ie 9:30 or 10am? PC would be willing to listen. However we do not have the staff to hold 2 services a week every Sunday, nor do we have the parishioners as yet.

**Visiting baptism families.** At the moment this is done by Rev'd Narelle at times convenient for the families. They are taken through the service, the meaning of Baptism, why they want their child Baptised, why baptism and not just a naming ceremony, whether communion is desired by the family on the day and the responsibilities of both parents and godparents.

Narelle has asked in the past if there is anyone who would like to join her in this ministry but has had no takers except Davina. The invitation is still open. Once again we can only do what we can do.

It is hoped that next year we will hold 4 services in the year – perhaps Sunday afternoon – to celebrate the lives of those children baptised. This depends on support from members of the congregation.

Parish Council have purchased some car mats and toys for children to have their own space down the front of the church. It is hoped that they will feel more at home in our big space.

#### Visiting the aged facilities in our area.

Bethany, Leincester place have a regular visit each month for a service from Narelle.

St Matthews has a service once a fortnight in Narelle's house.

Alexandra Gardens used to have a service once a month however due to lack of interest and support from the staff at that facility despite numerous requests by us that arrangement had to end.

North Rockhampton Aged facility has been approached about having a service on many occasions with no positive outcome as yet.

Most of the people who were on our pastoral care team are now unable to visit due to age or ill health themselves.

Bob looks after Shalom and home communions. Jen has filled in with hospital visits where possible when Narelle or Bob have not been able to visit due to Doctor's advice.

As you can see the clergy we have are doing all they can.

Any one got any other suggestions?

#### Pastoral care for the dying

Your three clergy are on call 24/7 to visit the sick and follow up families to arrange funerals and support after funerals.

Carol Morris delivers cards to bereaved families.

Davina Morrison supports Narelle with family visits and pastoral care afterwards to families in mourning.

**Anglicare** – suggested the basket for contributions be placed in the sanctuary – it is there.

There is a team of people who rally around the Wodes for fund raising and for making and wrapping at stalls – thanks.

Evelyn Stewart takes the contributions to Anglicare regularly. Anyone able to help? Sometimes the parcels are heavy.

MU have taken care of the mission to seafarers with help from the congregation. They also keep the need for help in domestic violence cases before our eyes..

There is a prayer chain available if people need prayer or wish to pray for others.

Christine Dobele holds many a stall for worthy causes backed by a team of people who help – thanks to all.

The men have their secret business meeting on a Wednesday. (all welcome)

The ladies have a coffee morning on a Monday. (all welcome)

Volunteers are always needed where pastoral care is concerned. Please don't sit and say what about ???????? or we should be doing, ask if you can be involved. Pray for those who do the hands on work and for the recipients. Thanks to those of you who do keep an eye on each other on a regular basis.
